Intelligent tutoring systems are expensive both to develop and implement. Metacognition Research has shown that both components of metacognition play key roles in metaconceptual knowledge and learning. There are generally two components of metacognition: (1) cognitive conceptions and (2) a cognitive regulation system. The metacognitive skills that are used to review an essay are the same as those that are used to verify an answer to a Metacognition is an awareness of one's thought processes and an understanding of the patterns behind them. Metacognition can take many forms, such as reflecting on one's ways of thinking, and knowing when and how oneself and others use particular strategies for problem-solving. Metamemory, defined as knowing about memory and mnemonic strategies, is an important aspect of metacognition.
