Placemaking Placemaking is both a process and a philosophy that makes use of urban design principles. experience at the pedestrian scale to build habits of locals. It is political due to the nature of place identity. It can be either official and government led, or community driven grassroots tactical urbanism, such as extending sidewalks with chalk, paint, and planters, or open streets events such as Bogotá, Colombia's Ciclovía. Good placemaking makes use of underutilized space to enhance the urban experience at the pedestrian scale to build habits of locals. The concepts behind placemaking originated in the 1960s, when writers like Jane Jacobs and William Placemaking is a multi-faceted approach to the planning, design and management of public spaces. Placemaking capitalizes on a local community's assets, inspiration, and potential, with the intention of creating public spaces that improve urban vitality and promote people's health, happiness, and well-being bc34729b37
