Metabolism proteomic and DNA microarray studies. The three main functions of metabolism are: converting the energy in food into a usable form for cellular processes; converting food to building blocks of macromolecules (biopolymers) such as proteins, lipids, nucleic acids, and some carbohydrates; and eliminating metabolic wastes. The word metabolism can also refer to all chemical reactions that occur in living organisms, including digestion and the transportation of substances into and between different cells. Using these techniques, a model of human metabolism has now been produced, which will guide future drug discovery and Metabolism (, from Greek: μεταβολή metabolē, "change") refers to the set of life-sustaining chemical reactions that occur within organisms. Typical colonies consist of various castes of sterile, wingless females... bd4541ae9b Quorum sensing is a type of cellular signaling, and can be more specifically considered a type of paracrine signaling. However, it also contains traits of autocrine signaling: a cell produces both an autoinducer molecule and the receptor for the autoinducer. As one example, quorum sensing enables bacteria to restrict the expression of specific genes to the high cell densities at which the resulting phenotypes will be most beneficial, especially for phenotypes that would be ineffective at low cell densities and therefore too energetically costly... bd4541ae9b
