Formative assessment The goal of a formative assessment is to monitor student learning to provide ongoing feedback that can help students identify their strengths and weaknesses and target areas that need work. It also helps faculty recognize where students are struggling and address problems immediately. It typically involves qualitative feedback (rather than scores) for both student and teacher that focuses on the details of content and performance. The taxonomy divides learning objectives into three broad domains: cognitive (knowledge-based), affective (emotion-based), and psychomotor (action-based), each with a hierarchy of skills and abilities. It was first introduced in the publication Taxonomy of Educational Objectives: The Classification of Educational Goals

Project-based learning It is a style of active learning and inquiry-based learning. Project-based learning contrasts with paper-based, rote memorization, or teacher-led instruction that presents established facts or portrays a smooth path to knowledge by instead posing questions, problems, or scenarios. Once the project is finished, the Project-based learning is a teaching method that involves a dynamic classroom approach in which it is believed that students acquire a deeper knowledge through active exploration of real-world challenges and problems. Students learn about a subject by working for an extended period of time to investigate and respond to a complex question, challenge, or problem. instructor uses these assessments to guide the inquiry process and ensure the students have learned the required content

Each student must demonstrate mastery of the content being studied and each student is accountable for their learning and work, therefore eliminating Cooperative learning is an educational approach which aims to organize classroom activities into academic and social learning experiences.
