Research To test the validity of instruments, procedures, or experiments, research may replicate elements of prior projects or the project as a whole. These activities are characterized by accounting and controlling for biases. Worked-example effect Specifically, it refers to improved learning observed when worked examples are used as part of instruction, compared to other instructional techniques such as problem-solving and discovery learning. Finally, worked examples can also increase germane load when prompts for self-explanations are used The worked-example effect is a learning effect predicted by cognitive load theory. According to Sweller: "The worked example effect is the best known and most widely studied of the cognitive load effects". worked examples at the beginning of skill acquisition dbea9759ed

Multimethodology Another applicable, but less often used label, for multi or mixed research is methodological pluralism. One could argue that mixed methods research is a special case of multimethod research. Mixed methods research is more specific in that it includes the mixing of qualitative and quantitative data, methods, methodologies, and/or paradigms in a research study or set of related studies. All of these approaches to professional and academic research emphasize that monomethod research can be improved through the use of multiple data sources, methods, research methodologies, perspectives, standpoints, and paradigms.
