Positive discipline Practitioners of positive discipline believe that good behavior can be taught and reinforced while weaning bad behaviors without hurting the child verbally or physically. It is based on the idea that there are no bad children, just good and bad behaviors. People engaging in positive discipline believe that they are not ignoring problems but dealing with the problem differently by helping the child learn how to handle situations more appropriately while remaining kind to the children themselves. Parenting styles Parenting styles also encompass the ways in which parents respond to and make demands on their children. Parents create their own parenting styles from a combination of factors that evolve over time. Parenting styles are distinct from specific parenting practices, since they represent broader patterns of practices and attitudes that create an emotional climate for the child. The study of parenting styles is based on the idea that parents differ in their patterns of parenting and that these patterns can have an impact on their children's development and well-being. childhood. The most common caretakers in parenting are the biological parents of the child in question. However, a caretaker may be an older sibling, step-parent, grandparent, legal guardian, aunt, uncle, other family members, or a family friend. Governments and society may also have a role in child-rearing or upbringing. In many cases, orphaned or abandoned children receive parental care from non-parent or non-blood relations. Others may be adopted, raised in foster care, or placed in an orphanage.

Positive behavior support People's inappropriate behaviors are difficult to change because they are functional; they serve a purpose for them (sensory needs, attachment/attention, escape or tangible). PBS uses functional analysis to understand what maintains an individual's challenging behavior and how to support the individual to get these needs met in more appropriate way, instead of using 'challenging behaviours'. These behaviors may be supported by reinforcement in the environment

Discipline Punishment may extinguish unwanted behavior in the moment, but is ineffective long-term; discipline, by contrast, includes the process of training self control. Such enforcement is sometimes based on punishment, although there is a clear difference between the two. The goal of positive discipline is to teach, train and guide children Discipline is the self-control that is gained by requiring that rules or orders be obeyed, and the ability to keep working at something that is difficult. concept of "positive parenting" where desirable behavior is encouraged and rewarded. Disciplinarians believe that such self-control is of the utmost importance and enforce a set of rules that aim to develop such behavior. One way to convey such differences is through the root meaning of each word: discipline means "to teach", while punishment means "to correct or cause pain"

The parent accomplishes this by conveying, role-modeling and enforcing boundaries which encourage the child to explore their personal freedom (trying their new wings) while practicing self-discipline as well.
