In response to the war's demands, the Army implemented several reforms. The establishment of the Selective Service Act in 1940 allowed for the conscription of millions of American men, dramatically increasing the size of the Army from about 190,000 active-duty personnel in 1940 to over 8 million by 1945. This required a vast expansion of personnel and resources, leading to the largest military mobilization in American history up to that point. S. Broadly speaking, "officer" means a commissioned officer, a non-commissioned officer (NCO), or a warrant officer. However, absent contextual qualification, the term typically refers only to a force's commissioned officers, the more senior members who derive their authority from a commission from the head of state. 5b41df7118

From the 1960s to the early 1990s, the Afghan Army was equipped by the Soviet Union. The roots of an army in Afghanistan can be traced back to the early 18th century when the Hotak dynasty was established in Kandahar followed by Ahmad Shah Durrani's rise to

power.
