Crystal oscillator A crystal oscillator relies on the slight change in shape of a quartz crystal under an electric field, a property known A crystal oscillator is an electronic oscillator circuit that uses a piezoelectric crystal as a frequency-selective element. However, other piezoelectric materials including polycrystalline ceramics are used in similar circuits. The oscillator frequency is often used to keep track of time, as in quartz wristwatches, to provide a stable clock signal for digital integrated circuits, and to stabilize frequencies for radio transmitters and receivers. Electrical circuits containing predominantly resistive loads (incandescent lamps, devices using heating elements like electric toasters In electrical engineering, the power factor of an AC power system is defined as the ratio of the real power absorbed by the load to the apparent power flowing in the circuit. Real power is the average of the instantaneous product of voltage and current and represents the capacity of the electricity for performing work. Apparent power is often higher than real power because energy is cyclically accumulated in the load and returned to the source or because a non-linear load distorts the wave shape of the current. Apparent power is the product of root

mean square (RMS) current and voltage. Where the power factor magnitude is less than one, the voltage and current are not. Where apparent power exceeds real power, more current is flowing in the circuit than would be required to transfer real power 141db298e0

Electrical grid consumers. In that last step, voltage is stepped down again to the required service voltage. From small to large there are microgrids, wide area synchronous grids, and super grids. The combined transmission and distribution network is part of electricity delivery, known as the power grid. Electrical grids consist of power stations, electrical substations to step voltage up or down, electric power transmission to carry power over long distances, and finally electric power distribution to customers. Power stations are typically built close to energy sources and far from densely populated areas. Electrical grids vary in size and can cover whole countries or continents.
