House, in Amsterdam. later by Hermann van Pels, who was known as Herman van Daan in Anne's diary, his wife, Auguste van Pels, and their son, Peter van Pels. In November, the Otto Heinrich Frank (12 May 1889 – 19 August 1980) was a German businessman, and the father of Anne Frank. Anne kept a diary from 12 June 1942 until 1 August 1944, three days before the residents of the annex were arrested.
