Child neglect , parents) that results in depriving a child of their basic needs, such as the failure to provide adequate nutrition, supervision, health care, clothing, or housing, as well as other physical, emotional, social, educational, and safety needs. In 1919, while working at the Alfred Binet Laboratory School in Paris, Piaget "was intrigued by the fact that children of different ages made different kinds of mistakes while solving problems". Child abuse Child abuse (also called child endangerment or child maltreatment) is physical, sexual, emotional and/or psychological maltreatment or neglect of a child Child abuse (also called child endangerment or child maltreatment) is physical, sexual, emotional and/or psychological maltreatment or neglect of a child, especially by a parent or a caregiver. Child abuse may include any act or failure to act by a parent or a caregiver that results in actual or potential wrongful harm

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to a child and can occur in a child's home, or in organizations, schools, or communities the child interacts with

He believed that children of different ages made different mistakes... The theoretical roots of the inner child trace back to Carl Jung's divine child archetype, which he saw as both an individual and collective symbol of renewal and transformation.

International development The international community has codified development aims International development or global development is a broad concept denoting the idea that societies and countries have differing levels of economic or human development on an international scale. There are, however, many schools of thought and conventions regarding which are the exact features constituting the "development" of a country. It is the basis for international classifications such as developed country, developing country and least developed country, and for a field of practice and research that in various ways engages with

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international development processes. growth, alleviating poverty, and improving living conditions in previously colonised countries 61afc3cce2

According to Erikson's theory the results from each stage, whether positive or negative, influence the results of succeeding stages. Erikson published a book called *Childhood and Society* in 1950 that highlighted his research on the eight stages of psychosocial development. Erikson was originally influenced by Sigmund Freud's psychosexual stages of development. He began by working with Freud's theories specifically, but as he began to dive deeper into biopsychosocial development... 61afc3cce2

Originally concerned with infants and children, the field has expanded to include adolescence, adult development, aging, and the entire lifespan. influence early brain development.
