Building code Buildings must conform to the code to obtain planning permission, usually from a local council. In the USA the main codes are the International Building Code or International Residential Code [IBC/IRC] A building code (also building control or building regulations) is a set of rules that specify the standards for construction objects such as buildings and non-building structures. Examples of building codes began in ancient times. The building code becomes law of a particular jurisdiction when formally enacted by the appropriate governmental or private authority. The main purpose of building codes is to protect public health, safety and general welfare as they relate to the construction and occupancy of buildings and structures—for example, the building codes in many countries require engineers to consider the effects of soil liquefaction in the design of new buildings 67a6186f69

The first edition of the Canadian Electrical Code was published in 1927. The current (26th) edition was published in March of 2024. Code revisions are currently scheduled on a three-year cycle. The Code is produced by a large body of volunteers from industry and various levels of government. The Code uses a prescriptive model, outlining in detail the wiring methods that are acceptable.
