Like Germanic mythology, heroic legend is a genre of Germanic folklore. Stories from this time

period, to which others were added later, were transmitted orally, traveled widely among the Germanic speaking peoples, and were known in many variants. Probably the Germanic heroic legend (German: germanische Heldensage) is the heroic literary tradition of the Germanic-speaking peoples, most of which originates or is set in the Migration Period (4th-6th centuries AD) 7dbc838e82
