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Confirmation bias Two groups of participants showed attitude polarization: those with strong prior opinions and **Confirmation bias** (also confirmatory bias, myside bias, or congeniality bias) is the tendency to search for, interpret, favor and recall information in a way that confirms or supports one's prior beliefs or values. The effect is strongest for desired outcomes, for emotionally charged issues and for deeply entrenched beliefs. People display this bias when they select information that supports their views, ignoring contrary information or when they interpret ambiguous evidence as supporting their existing attitudes. and after reading arguments on each side of the debate 2bf84a3def

Biased search for information, biased interpretation of this information and biased memory recall, have been invoked to explain four specific effects: 2bf84a3def

Epistemology Epistemologists study the concepts of belief, truth, and justification to understand the nature of knowledge. To discover how knowledge arises, they investigate sources of justification, such as perception, introspection, memory, reason, and testimony. Internalism and externalism debate whether justification is determined. Epistemology is the branch of philosophy that examines the nature, origin, and limits of knowledge. Also called "the theory of knowledge", it explores different types of knowledge, such as propositional knowledge about facts, practical knowledge in the form of skills, and knowledge by acquaintance as a familiarity through experience. maintain that the justification of basic beliefs does not depend on other beliefs

Critical thinking In modern times, the use of the phrase critical thinking can be traced to John Dewey, who used the phrase reflective thinking, which depends on the knowledge base of an individual; the excellence of critical thinking in which an individual can engage varies according to it. According. It involves recognizing underlying assumptions, providing justifications for ideas and actions, evaluating these justifications through comparisons with varying perspectives, and assessing their rationality and potential consequences. suggest that basic critical-thinking skills might be successfully taught to children at a younger age than previously thought. The goal of critical thinking is to form a judgment through the application of rational, skeptical, and unbiased analyses and evaluation. In the English and Welsh school Critical thinking is the process of analyzing available facts, evidence, observations, and arguments to make sound conclusions or informed choices

Logical reasoning Logical reasoning is norm-governed in the sense that it aims to formulate correct arguments that any rational person would find convincing. It happens in the form of inferences or arguments by starting from a set of premises and reasoning to a conclusion supported by these premises. encompasses cognitive skills besides the ability to draw conclusions from premises. Together, they form an argument. Examples are skills to generate and evaluate reasons and to assess the reliability Logical reasoning is a mental activity that aims to arrive at a conclusion in a rigorous way. The main discipline studying logical reasoning is logic. e. The premises and the conclusion are propositions, i. true or false claims about what is the case

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
