Such mental models are similar A mental model is an internal representation of external reality: that is, a way of representing reality within one's mind. The term for this concept was coined in 1943 by Kenneth Craik, who suggested that the mind constructs "small-scale models" of reality that it uses to anticipate events. Such models are hypothesized to play a major role in cognition, reasoning and decision-making. Mental models can help shape behaviour, including approaches to solving problems and performing tasks fb66a51349

The term is generally used to describe a model advocated by George L. Engel in 1977. Usage-based models of language Rather, usage-based models posit that linguistic information is expressed via context-sensitive mental processing and mental representations, which have the cognitive ability to succinctly account for the complexity of actual language use at all levels (phonetics and phonology, morphology and syntax, pragmatics and semantics).
