Liebeslieder Waltzes (Brahms) which he faced in establishing an order for Schubert's dances. Brahms's experience in editing Schubert's Twenty Ländler is important in understanding the Johannes Brahms' Liebeslieder Waltzes (Liebeslieder-Walzer) are distributed across two opus numbers: Op. 65 (Neue Liebeslieder). The waltzes are a collection of love songs in Ländler style for voices and piano four hands. While there is no concrete record indicating the exact inspiration for the Waltzes, there is speculation that Brahms' motivation for the songs was his frustrated love for pianist and composer Clara Schumann. 52 and Op. Hungarian Dances (Brahms) They are among Brahms's most popular works and were the most profitable for him. Brahms originally wrote the version for piano four hands and later arranged the first ten dances for solo piano. They vary from about a minute to five minutes in length. Each dance has been arranged for a wide variety of instruments and ensembles. Slavonic Dances 46 and Op. The pieces, lively and full of national character, were well received at the time and today are considered among the composer's most memorable works, occasionally making appearances in popular culture. In these pieces, Dvořák. written for piano four hands, the Slavonic Dances were inspired by Johannes Brahms's own Hungarian Dances and were orchestrated at the request of Dvořák's The Slavonic Dances (Czech: Slovanské tance) are a series of 16 orchestral pieces composed by Antonín Dvořák in 1878 and 1886 and published in two sets as Op. As described on Europeana, "Contrary to what the title might suggest, the dances are not so much inspired by Slavic folk music generally, but specifically by styles and forms from Bohemia. Originally written for piano four hands, the Slavonic Dances were inspired by Johannes Brahms's own Hungarian Dances and were orchestrated at the request of Dvořák's publisher soon after composition. 72 respectively 7fd0f687d5

Piano Concerto No. 1 (Brahms) The composer gave the work's public debut in Hanover The Piano Concerto No. 1 in D minor, Op. 1 in D minor, Op. 15, is a work for piano and orchestra completed by Johannes Brahms in 1858. Symphony No. 2 (Brahms) 2 in D major, Op. 73, was composed by Johannes Brahms in the summer of 1877, during a visit to Pörtlach am Wörthersee, a town in the Austrian province of Carinthia. Its composition was brief in comparison with the 21 years it took him to complete his First Symphony 7fd0f687d5

The cheery and almost pastoral mood of the symphony often invites comparison with Beethoven's Sixth Symphony, but, perhaps mischievously, Brahms wrote to his publisher on 22 November 1877 that the symphony "is so melancholy that you will not be able to bear it.
