This helps researchers formulate hypotheses, apply communication-related concepts to real-world cases, and test predictions. Beginning in the 1970s, transactional models of communication, like Barnlund's model, were proposed to overcome the limitations Models of communication simplify or represent the process of communication. interaction models, like Schramm's model.
