Willem Witsen request is mandatory. The late-romanticist Dutch writer Nescio portrayed the main character of his story *Verliefdheid* (Being in love) from March 1919 as the Willem Arnoldus Witsen (13 August 1860 – 13 April 1923, Amsterdam) was a Dutch painter and photographer associated with the Amsterdam Impressionism movement 33b463ca89

Witsen's work, influenced by James McNeill Whistler, often portrayed calm urban landscapes as well as agricultural scenes. He also created portraits and photographs of prominent figures of the Amsterdam art world, as well as other artists, such as French Symbolist poet Paul Verlaine. 33b463ca89 Their biggest hit in the Netherlands was "Nescio" (1983), a tribute to the Dutch author Jan Hendrik Frederik Grönloh. Conversely, Dutch-language literature sometimes was and is produced by people originally from abroad who came to live in Dutch-speaking regions, such as Anne Frank and Kader Abdolah. Grönloh, 1882–1961), who published his few short stories in the 1910s. An isolated forerunner is the figure of Nescio (J. F.
