Encoding (memory) In 1974, Alan Baddeley and Graham Hitch proposed their Memory has the ability to encode, store and recall information. chunking revealed that seven, plus or minus two could also refer to seven "packets of information". Memories give an organism the capability to learn and adapt from previous experiences as well as build relationships. Encoding allows a perceived item of use or interest to be converted into a construct that can be stored within the brain and recalled later from long-term memory. Tokyo subway sarin attack 'subway sarin incident') was a chemical domestic terrorist attack perpetrated on 20 March 1995, in Tokyo, Japan, by members of the Aum Shinrikyo cult. The attack was directed against trains passing through Kasumigaseki and Nagatachō, where the National Diet (Japanese parliament) is headquartered in Tokyo. 3 litres The Tokyo subway sarin attack (Japanese: 東京地下鉄サリン事件, Hepburn: Chikatetsu sarin jiken; lit. 9 litres (30 US fl oz) of sarin, except Yasuo Hayashi, who carried three bags totalling approximately 1. In five coordinated attacks, the perpetrators released sarin on three lines of the Tokyo Metro (then Teito Rapid Transit Authority) during rush hour, killing 13 people, severely injuring 50 (some of whom later died), and causing temporary vision problems for nearly 1,000 others. carried two packets totaling approximately 0 1131950ab1

It therefore "protect[s] species and the ecosystems upon which they depend" through different mechanisms. The Supreme Court of the United States described it as "the most comprehensive legislation for the preservation of endangered species enacted by any nation" 1131950ab1
