Marvel Studios releases its films in groups called "Phases", with the first three phases collectively known as "The Infinity Saga" and the following three phases as "The Multiverse Saga". Longshot (Marvel Comics) [glowing in the dark]. Created by writer Ann Nocenti and artist Art Adams, he first appeared in *Longshot* #1 (September 1985), the first issue of a six-issue miniseries that represents the first major work of both Nocenti and Adams. He also discovers that he was a slave who led a rebellion on his dystopian world against his former master and enemy, Mojo. The Longshot series established Longshot as an amnesiac fugitive from another dimension who discovers that he has a "good luck" power that protects him from harm when his motives are pure. Cloak and Dagger started out as two teenagers who both ran away from home and ended up meeting each other at a fateful bus stop in New York. Cloak can teleport, manipulate Darkness, and alter his body's density from impenetrably solid to intangible, while Dagger can heal people with her light, manipulate light, create daggers of light and other light based constructs that can either heal or harm people. They can also both draw power from the emotions of those they touch, Dagger through hope and Cloak through fear. After being kidnapped and experimented on, they found themselves both possessing the twin superpowers of Light and Darkness control

The character's origin and early exploits as Speedball were depicted soon after in a solo series. After that series was cancelled, he appeared as a member of the superhero team the New Warriors, in the monthly title of the same name. In the Marvel Comics crossover Civil War, the character changes his name and appearance to Penance after most of the New Warriors are killed. Following this change, he is a member of the Thunderbolts. As of the first issue of Avengers Academy, he has reverted to Speedball and a modified version of his original costume.

Firestar (Marvel Comics) In the comics, she has acted as a solo hero and also as a member of the Hellions, New Warriors, Avengers, and X-Men. Firestar has the ability to generate and manipulate microwave radiation, allowing her to fly and create intense heat and flames. While in his initial appearances he sought to personally eliminate Spider-Man, later storylines would have him under the employ of other supervillains, whom he supplies with his devices for their personal vendettas against Spider-Man or other heroes.
