The compound is an acid. Removal of all three  $\text{H}^+$  ions gives the phosphate ion  $\text{PO}_3^{4-}$ . Removal of one or two protons gives dihydrogen phosphate ion  $\text{H}_2\text{PO}_4^-$ , and the hydrogen phosphate ion  $\text{HPO}_2^{4-}$ , respectively. Ethylene oxide It is a cyclic ether and the simplest epoxide: a three-membered ring consisting of one oxygen atom and two carbon atoms. Because it is a strained ring, ethylene oxide easily participates in a number of addition reactions that result in ring-opening. Ethylene oxide is a colorless and flammable gas with a faintly sweet odor. Ethylene oxide is isomeric with acetaldehyde and with vinyl alcohol. further purification. Ethylene oxide is industrially produced by oxidation of ethylene in the presence of a silver catalyst. The first commercial plant which uses this method was opened in 2008 in South Korea. **Microfiltration** The use of more cost effective cleaning chemicals where suitable (sulphuric acid instead of citric/ phosphoric acids. ) The use of a flexible Microfiltration is a type of physical filtration process where a contaminated fluid is passed through a special pore-sized membrane filter to separate microorganisms and suspended particles from process liquid. initial period. It is commonly used in conjunction with various other separation processes such as ultrafiltration and reverse osmosis to provide a product stream which is free of undesired contaminants dd6ae1c6f1

**Lead** is a relatively unreactive post-transition metal. Its weak metallic character is shown by its amphoteric behavior: lead and lead oxides react with both acids and bases, and it tends to form covalent bonds. Lead compounds usually occur in the +2 oxidation state rather than the +4 state common in lighter members of the carbon... dd6ae1c6f1 The name "orthophosphoric acid" can be used to distinguish this specific acid from other "phosphoric acids", such as pyrophosphoric acid. The most stable isotope,  $^{232}\text{Th}$ , has a half-life of 14.0 billion years, or about the age of the universe; it decays very slowly via alpha decay, starting a decay chain named the thorium series that ends at stable  $^{208}\text{Pb}$ . On Earth, thorium and uranium are the only elements with no stable or nearly-stable isotopes that still occur naturally... dd6ae1c6f1

**Phosphoric acid** It is a major industrial chemical, being a component of many fertilizers. Phosphoric acid (orthophosphoric acid, monophosphoric acid or phosphoric(V) acid) is a colorless, odorless phosphorus-containing solid, and inorganic Phosphoric acid (orthophosphoric acid, monophosphoric acid or phosphoric(V) acid) is a colorless, odorless phosphorus-containing solid, and inorganic compound with the chemical formula  $\text{H}_3\text{PO}_4$ . Many sources of fertilizer exist, both natural and industrially produced. Farmers apply these fertilizers in a variety of ways: through dry or pelletized or liquid application processes, using large agricultural equipment, or hand-tool methods. Fertilizers may be distinct from liming materials or other non-nutrient soil amendments. For most modern agricultural practices, fertilization focuses on three main macro nutrients: nitrogen (N), phosphorus (P), and potassium (K) with occasional addition of supplements like rock flour for micronutrients. Diethyl ether It is a colourless, highly volatile, sweet-smelling ("ethereal odour"), extremely flammable liquid. ), is an organic compound with the chemical formula  $(\text{CH}_3\text{CH}_2)_2\text{O}$ , sometimes abbreviated as  $\text{Et}_2\text{O}$ . It is a common solvent and was formerly used as a general anesthetic.
