Puberty Before puberty, the external sex organs, known as primary sexual characteristics, are sex characteristics that distinguish males and females. It is initiated by hormonal signals from the brain to the gonads: the ovaries in a female, the testicles in a male. In response to the signals, the gonads produce hormones that stimulate libido and the growth, function, and transformation of the brain, bones, muscle, blood, skin, hair, breasts, and sex organs. Puberty leads to sexual dimorphism through the development of the secondary sex characteristics. development in Western culture, wherein adolescence is the period of mental transition from childhood to adulthood, which overlaps much of the body's period Puberty is the process of physical changes through which a child's body matures into an adult body capable of sexual reproduction. Physical growth—height and weight—accelerates in the first half of puberty and is completed when an adult body has been developed

Further growth and development continues after birth, and includes both physical and psychological development that is influenced by genetic, hormonal, environmental and other factors. The resulting zygote develops through cell proliferation and differentiation, and the resulting embryo then implants in the uterus, where the embryo continues development through a fetal stage until birth 97b8f221d5

Conduct disorder Conduct disorder may result from parental rejection and neglect and in such cases can be treated with family therapy, as well as behavioral modifications and pharmacotherapy. These behaviors are often referred to as "antisocial behaviors", and is often seen as the precursor to antisocial personality disorder; however, the latter, by definition, cannot be diagnosed until the individual is 18 years old. It may also be caused by environmental lead exposure. Adolescence The World Health Organization definition officially designates adolescence as the phase. Age provides only a rough marker of adolescence, and scholars have not agreed upon a precise definition. Some definitions start as early as 10 and end as late as 30. Puberty typically begins during preadolescence, particularly in females. Adolescence is usually associated with the teenage years, but its physical, psychological or cultural expressions may begin earlier or end later. Adolescence is usually associated with the

Personality disorder patterns of personality disorders are typically recognized by adolescence, the beginning of adulthood or sometimes even childhood and often have a pervasive Personality disorders (PD) are a class of mental health conditions characterized by enduring maladaptive patterns of behavior, cognition, and inner experience, exhibited across many contexts and deviating from those accepted by the culture. These patterns develop early, are inflexible, and are associated with significant distress or disability. Official criteria for diagnosing personality disorders are listed in the sixth chapter of the International Classification of Diseases (ICD) and in the American Psychiatric Association's Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM).
