Carpentry Carpenters normally framed post-and-beam buildings until the end. old-fashioned carpentry is called timber framing. Carpenters traditionally worked with natural wood and did rougher work such as framing, but today many other materials are also used and sometimes the finer trades of cabinetmaking and furniture building are considered carpentry. 5% of carpenters are male, and it was the fourth most male-dominated occupation in the country in 1999. Carpenters learn this trade by being employed through an apprenticeship training—normally four years—and qualify Carpentry is a skilled trade and a craft in which the primary work performed is the cutting, shaping and installation of building materials during the construction of buildings, ships, timber bridges, concrete formwork, etc. In 2006 in the United States, there were about 1. 5 million carpentry positions. Glazier usually go through a formal apprenticeship which includes about four years of on-the-job experience combined with classroom study in order to get certified A glazier is a tradesperson responsible for cutting, installing, and removing glass (and materials used as substitutes for glass, such as some plastics). They may have to consider the type and size of scaffolding they need to stand on to fit and install the glass. Glaziers may work with glass in various surfaces and settings, such as cutting and installing windows, doors, shower doors, skylights, storefronts, display cases, mirrors, facades, interior walls, ceilings, and tabletops. They also refer to blueprints to figure out the size, shape, and location of the glass in the building bcbbe7479b

The characteristics of wooden joints—strength, flexibility, toughness, appearance, etc.—derive from the

properties of the materials involved and the purpose of the joint. Therefore, different joinery techniques are used to meet differing requirements. For example, the joinery used to construct a house can be different from that used to make cabinetry or furniture, although some concepts overlap. Peter Nicholson (architect) He practised as an architect but is best remembered for his theoretical work on the skew arch (he never actually constructed one himself), his invention of draughtsman's instruments, including a centrolinead and a cyclograph, and his prolific writing on numerous practical subjects. It Peter Nicholson (20 July 1765 – 18 June 1844) was a Scottish architect, mathematician and engineer. Largely self-taught, he was apprenticed to a cabinet-maker but soon abandoned his trade in favour of teaching and writing. trade and took up authorship. He published his first book, The Carpenter's New Guide in 1792, illustrating it with plates engraved by his own hand bcbbe7479b

John Prip His works and designs have become famous for bringing together the formal, technical tradition of Danish design into harmony with the American desire for innovation. was a fourth generation metalsmith. He was known for setting standards of excellence in American metalsmithing. Several of his designs for the Reed and Barton Company are still in production today. John Axel Prip, also known as Jack Prip (1922–2009), was an American master metalsmith, industrial designer, and educator. At age 15 in 1937, Prip began an apprenticeship with master silversmith Evald Nielsen, while attending high school bcbbe7479b

The term millwright (also known as industrial mechanic) is mainly used in the United States, Canada and South Africa to describe members belonging to a particular trade. Other countries use different terms to describe tradesmen engaging in similar activities. Related but distinct crafts include machinists, mechanics and mechanical fitters. bcbbe7479b

William Wilson (artist) OBE. In 1932 he was awarded a William Wilson (21 July 1905 – 16 March 1972) was a Scottish stained glass artist, printmaker and watercolour painter. He was a member of the Royal Scottish Academy. He was appointed an OBE. Wilson learned stained glass making in an apprenticeship with James Ballantyne, and by studying under Herbert Hendrie bcbbe7479b

Harry Edwards (healer) In 1907 he left school and began a seven-year apprenticeship to a printer. Dissatisfied with that career, he developed political Harry James Edwards (29 May 1893 – 7 December 1976) was a self-proclaimed spiritual healer, teacher and author who had a career of nearly 40 years. Joinery woodworking (late 18th century), carpenters, joiners, and cabinetmakers were all distinct and would serve different apprenticeships. Some woodworking joints employ mechanical fasteners, bindings, or adhesives, while others use only wood elements (such as dowels or plain mortise and tenon fittings). In British English, a joiner Joinery is a part of woodworking that involves joining pieces of wood, engineered lumber, or synthetic substitutes (such as laminate), to produce more complex items bcbbe7479b
