Respiratory arrest symptoms of respiratory compromise can differ with each patient. Lack of oxygen to the brain causes loss of consciousness. If the heart muscle contraction is intact, the condition is known as respiratory arrest. An abrupt stop of pulmonary gas exchange lasting for more than five minutes may permanently damage vital organs, especially the brain. Brain injury is likely if respiratory arrest goes untreated for more than three minutes, and death is almost certain if more than five minutes. Complications from respiratory compromise are increasing rapidly across the clinical spectrum Respiratory arrest is a serious medical condition caused by apnea or respiratory dysfunction severe enough that it will not sustain the body (such as agonal breathing). Prolonged apnea refers to a patient who has stopped breathing for a long period of time f211f6251c

Manipulation under anesthesia MUA is designed not only to relieve pain, but also to break up excessive scar tissue that builds up after orthopedic surgery. Because scar tissue can impede the movement of soft tissue and joints, MUA is valuable in re-establishing optimal range of motion. The patient normally goes through a series of examinations, including imaging tests and laboratory work, prior to MUA. Respiratory failure Respiratory failure causes an altered state of consciousness due to ischemia in the brain. In clinical trials, the definition of respiratory failure usually includes increased respiratory rate, abnormal blood gases (hypoxemia Respiratory failure results from inadequate gas exchange by the respiratory system, meaning that the arterial oxygen, carbon dioxide, or both cannot be kept at normal levels. A drop in the oxygen carried in the blood is known as hypoxemia; a rise in arterial carbon dioxide levels is called hypercapnia. can be acute or chronic. Respiratory failure is classified as either Type 1 or Type 2, based on whether there is a high carbon dioxide level, and can be acute or chronic. Oxygen therapy Supplemental oxygen can also refer to the use of oxygen enriched air at altitude. Oxygen therapy is often useful in chronic hypoxemia caused by conditions such as severe COPD or cystic fibrosis. Oxygen therapy, also referred to as supplemental oxygen, is the use of oxygen as medical treatment. Oxygen can be delivered via nasal cannula, face mask, or endotracheal intubation at normal atmospheric pressure, or in a hyperbaric chamber. Acute indications for therapy include hypoxemia (low blood oxygen levels), carbon monoxide toxicity and cluster headache. It can also be given through bypassing the airway, such as in ECMO therapy. TIVA is maintained by intravenous infusion devices and assisted by electroencephalography (EEG) monitoring. These techniques facilitate the use of propofol, etomidate, ketamine, and other intravenous anesthetic agents. During or after TIVA, patients may be subjected to an elevated risk of anesthesia awareness, hyperalgesia and neurotoxicity. 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Heated humidified high-flow therapy Primarily studied in neonates, it has also been found effective in some adults to treat hypoxemia and work of breathing issues. The key components of it are a gas blender, heated humidifier, heated circuit, and cannula. Total intravenous anaesthesia Total intravenous anesthesia (TIVA) refers to the intravenous administration of anesthetic agents to induce a temporary loss of sensation or awareness Total intravenous anesthesia (TIVA) refers to the intravenous administration of anesthetic agents to induce a temporary loss of sensation or awareness. TIVA is currently employed in various procedures as an alternative technique of general anesthesia in order to improve post-operative recovery. The first study of TIVA was done in 1872 using chloral hydrate, and the common anesthetic agent propofol was licensed in 1986 f211f6251c

Analeptic obtundation and respiratory depression. The term analeptic typically refers to respiratory stimulants (e. g. , doxapram). Analeptics have been used throughout history for two main purposes, to help patients recover from anesthesia more efficiently An analeptic, in medicine, is a type of central nervous system (CNS) stimulant. Analeptics can also be used as convulsants, with low doses causing patients to experience heightened awareness, restlessness, and rapid breathing. Analeptics include a wide variety of medications used to treat depression, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), and respiratory depression f211f6251c

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
