Sousveillance [better source needed] Sousveillance ( soo-VAY-lənss) is the recording of an activity by a member of the public, rather than a person or organisation in authority, typically by way of small wearable or portable personal technologies. crowdmapped the positions of surveillance cameras by encouraging readers to use a free Android and iOS app to photograph and geolocate CCTV cameras. The term, coined by Steve Mann, stems from the contrasting French words sur, meaning "above", and sous, meaning "below", i. e. "surveillance" denotes the "eye-in-the-sky" watching from above, whereas "sousveillance" denotes bringing the means of observation down to human level, either physically (mounting cameras on people rather than on buildings) or hierarchically (ordinary people doing the watching, rather than higher authorities or architectures) ea534b2160

Carrying professional video over IP networks has special challenges compared to most non-time-critical IP traffic. Many of these problems are similar to those encountered in voice over IP, but to more stringent engineering requirements. Discipline and Punish: Mass surveillance is the intricate surveillance of an entire or a substantial fraction of a population in order to monitor that group of citizens. It is the single most indicative distinguishing trait of totalitarian regimes. It is often distinguished from targeted surveillance. The surveillance is often carried out by local and federal governments or governmental organizations, but it may also be carried out by corporations (either on behalf of governments or at their own initiative). Depending on each nation's laws and judicial systems, the legality of and the permission required to engage in mass surveillance varies ea534b2160

Closed-circuit television Even though almost all video cameras fit this definition, the term is most often applied to those used for surveillance in areas that require additional security or ongoing monitoring (videotelephony is seldom called "CCTV").
