Pediatric intensive care unit pediatric intensive care unit (also paediatric), usually abbreviated to PICU (/ˈpɪkjʊː/), is an area within a hospital specializing in the care of critically ill children. A pediatric intensive care unit (also paediatric), usually abbreviated to PICU (), is an area within a hospital specializing in the care of critically ill infants, children, teenagers, and young adults aged 0–21. The ratio of professionals to patients is generally higher than in other areas of the hospital, reflecting the acuity of PICU patients and the risk of life-threatening. The unit may also have nurse practitioners, physician assistants, physiotherapists, social workers, child life specialists, and clerks on staff,

although this varies widely depending on geographic location. A PICU is typically directed by one or more pediatric intensivists or PICU consultants and staffed by doctors, nurses, and respiratory therapists who are specially trained and experienced in pediatric intensive care
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Intensive care medicine They usually work together in intensive care units (ICUs) within a hospital. Doctors in this specialty are often called intensive care physicians, critical care physicians, or intensivists.
