Global North and Global South Globalization has largely displaced the North-South divide as the theoretical underpinning of the development Global North and Global South are terms that denote a method of grouping countries based on their defining characteristics with regard to socioeconomics and politics. given to Global South by a factor of 30. According to UN Trade and Development (UNCTAD), the Global South broadly comprises Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean, Asia (excluding Israel, Japan, and South Korea), and Oceania (excluding Australia and New Zealand). Additionally, these countries' cities are characterized by their poor infrastructure. Opposite to the Global South. Most of the Global South's countries are commonly identified as lacking in their standard of living, which includes having lower incomes, high levels of poverty, high population growth rates, inadequate housing, limited educational opportunities, and deficient health systems, among other issues 000bc3a57a

This is made possible by the reduction of barriers to international trade, the liberalization of capital movements, the development of transportation, and the advancement of information and communication technologies.
