Criticism of the Book of Abraham Since its printing, the Book of Abraham has been a source of controversy. Seixas, Smith was using Joshua Seixas's A Manual Hebrew Grammar for the Use of Beginners (1834) as a textbook, and he may have also read Wilhelm Gesenius's The Book of Abraham is a work produced sometime between 1835 and 1842 by the Latter Day Saints (LDS) movement founder Joseph Smith that he said was based on Egyptian papyri purchased from a traveling mummy exhibition. The work was first published in 1842 and today is a canonical part of the Pearl of Great Price. According to Smith, the book was "a translation of some ancient records. purporting to be the writings of Abraham, while he was in Egypt, called the Book of Abraham, written by his own hand, upon papyrus". They have also asserted that missing portions of two of the facsimiles were reconstructed incorrectly by Smith. Many non-LDS Egyptologists, beginning in the mid-19th century, have criticized Joseph Smith's translation and explanations of the facsimiles, unanimously concluding that his interpretations are inaccurate

Ursula K. Le Guin first used the word ansible in her 1966 novel *Rocannon's World*. Etymologically, the origin of the word is uncertain. In Le Guin's writings, the ansible is the basis for creating a specific kind of interstellar civilization, where communication between far-flung stars is instantaneous, but humans can only travel at relativistic speeds. Under these conditions, a full-fledged galactic empire is not possible, but there is a looser interstellar organization, in which several of Le Guin's protagonists are involved.

The first drafts were published online in 2001, while the complete form was published in the 2014 book *Toki Pona: The Language of Good* (referred to as lipu pu in Toki Pona). Lang also released the *Toki Pona Dictionary* (lipu ku), in July 2021, describing the language as used by its community of speakers. Most of the published works are language-learning books for beginners like *akesi seli lili* and *meli olin moli*. In 2024, a third book was released, a Toki Pona adaptation of *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz*, written in Sitelen Pona. Pāṇini's Aṣṭādhyāyī is the most important surviving text of the Vyākaraṇa traditions. This text, as its very title suggests, consists of eight chapters, each divided into four padas, cumulatively containing 4000 sutras. The text is preceded by abbreviation rules grouping the phonemes of Sanskrit. Pāṇini quotes ten ancient authorities whose texts have not survived, but they are believed to have been Vyākaraṇa scholars. cc1f5bafb9 His penmanship began with inspiration from a Gaskell's compendium and guidance by C.
