Gunsmiths do modifications and changes to a firearm that may require a very high level of craftsmanship, requiring the skills of a top-level machinist, a very skilled woodworker, and even an engineer. Repairs and redesigns may require fabrication and fitting of unavailable parts and assemblies constructed by smiths themselves. The United States Army trains and employs MOS 45B - Small Arms Gunsmith. A gunsmith is a person who repairs, modifies, designs, or builds guns. They may make alterations to adapt sporting guns to better fit the individual shooter that may require extensive modifications to the firearm's stocks and metal parts.

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Point shooting In close quarters combat, where life-threatening situations emerge very quickly, sighted marksmanship techniques become risky, so advocates Point shooting (also known as target- or threat-focused shooting, intuitive shooting, instinctive shooting, subconscious tactical shooting, or hipfiring) is a practical shooting method where the shooter points a ranged weapon (typically a repeating firearm) at a target without relying on the use of sights

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to aim. Emphasis is placed on fast draw and trying to score preemptive hits first. In close quarters combat, where life-threatening situations emerge very quickly, sighted marksmanship techniques become risky, so advocates of point shooting emphasize a less sighting-oriented style that prioritizes the tactical advantages of quick fire superiority and suppression. preemptive hits first 08fa91761f
