Methodist Episcopal Church Colonies, and Methodist societies were formed under the oversight of John Wesley. In 1968, the Methodist Church merged with the Evangelical United Brethren Church to form the United Methodist Church. In 1939, the MEC reunited with two breakaway Methodist denominations (the Methodist Protestant Church and the Methodist Episcopal Church, South) to form the Methodist Church. It was also the first religious denomination in the US to organize itself nationally. Organisation of the Methodist Church of Great Britain No singular church community has ever been seen in isolation either from its immediately neighbouring church communities or from the centralised national organisation. Wesley himself journeyed around the country, preaching and establishing local worshipping communities, called "societies", often under lay leadership. Wesley did not claim the class as essential or of "divine The organisation of the Methodist Church of Great Britain is based on the principle of connexionalism. The ticket is the membership card for Methodists. Soon these local communities of worshipping Christians formalised their relationships with neighbouring Methodist communities to create "circuits", and the circuits.
