Crime in the United States Within the better data for crime reporting and recording available starting in the 1930s, crime reached its broad, bulging modern peak between the 1970s and early 1990s. After 1992, crime rates have generally trended downwards each year, with the exceptions of a slight increase in property crimes. Instead, violent crime during the colonial period was likely three times higher than the highest modern rates in the data currently available, and crime had been on the decline since colonial times. Most available data underestimate crime before the 1930s (due to incomplete datasets and other factors), giving the false impression that crime was low in the early 1900s and had a sharp rise after.

In July 2012, Ancestry. 1650) was an African-born resident of the English colony of Virginia who became its first person legally enslaved under criminal law. In contrast, John Casor became the colonies' first person legally enslaved under civil law, having committed no crime.

Smith v Gould (1705–07) 2 Salk 666 V. C. By the middle of the 12th century, the institution of slavery as it had existed prior to the Norman conquest had fully disappeared, but other forms of unfree servitude continued for some centuries.
