Stigma is defined as a powerfully negative label that changes a person's self-concept and social identity. Howard Saul Becker's book *Outsiders* was extremely influential in the development of this theory and its rise to popularity. Labeling theory holds that deviance is not inherent in an act, but instead focuses on the tendency of majorities to negatively label minorities or those seen as deviant from standard cultural norms. The theory was prominent during the 1960s and 1970s, and some modified versions of the theory have developed and are still currently popular.
