Knowledge Knowledge of facts, also called propositional knowledge, is often characterized as true belief that is distinct from opinion or guesswork by virtue of justification. These controversies intensified in the latter half of the 20th century due to a series of thought experiments called Gettier cases that provoked alternative definitions. Knowledge is an awareness of facts, a familiarity with individuals and situations, or a practical skill. While there is wide agreement among philosophers that propositional knowledge is a form of true belief, many controversies focus on justification. history of science, but covers a wider area that includes knowledge from fields like philosophy, mathematics, education, literature, art, and religion.
