He was the founder and president of the Heroic Imagination Project, a non-profit. experimentally rigorous studies. He became known for his 1971 Stanford prison experiment, which was later criticized

W. *Psychological Science*, 1995). In 1879, Wilhelm Wundt founded the first psychological laboratory dedicated exclusively to psychological research in Leipzig, Germany. Wundt was...
