Extraneous and missing solutions can occur when performing operations on expressions that are invalid for certain values of those expressions. A missing solution is a valid one which is lost during the solution process. Both situations frequently result from performing operations that are not invertible for some or all values of the variables involved, which prevents the chain of logical implications from being bidirectional. For example, if we were solving the following In mathematics, an extraneous solution (or spurious solution) is one which emerges from the process of solving a problem but is not a valid solution to it.

a $\frac{a}{b} \times \frac{c}{d} = \frac{e}{f}$ is an expression, while the inequality $\frac{a}{b} = \frac{c}{d}$ is an equation. Fraction A common, vulgar, or simple fraction (examples: $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{17}{3}$) consists of an integer numerator, displayed above a line (or before a slash like $\frac{1}{2}$), and a non-zero integer denominator, displayed below (or after) that line. When spoken in everyday English, a fraction describes how many parts of a certain size there are, for example, one-half, eight-fifths, three-quarters.
