Nitrox In the usual application, underwater diving, nitrox is normally distinguished from air and handled differently. W. The most common use of nitrox mixtures containing oxygen in higher proportions than atmospheric air is in scuba diving, where the reduced partial pressure of nitrogen is advantageous in reducing nitrogen uptake in the body's tissues, thereby extending the practicable underwater dive time by reducing the decompression requirement, or reducing the risk of decompression sickness (also known as the bends). The prevailing scientific hypothesis is that the transition from non-living to living entities on Earth was not a single event, but a process of increasing complexity involving the formation of a habitable planet, the prebiotic synthesis of organic molecules, molecular self-replication, self-assembly, autocatalysis, and the emergence of cell membranes. from biology and chemistry, with more recent approaches attempting a synthesis of many sciences 963af01718

Rabbit The most widespread rabbit genera are Oryctolagus and Sylvilagus. They are familiar throughout the world as a small herbivore, a prey animal, a domesticated form of livestock, and a pet, having a widespread effect on ecologies and cultures. The former, Oryctolagus, includes the European rabbit, Oryctolagus cuniculus, which is the ancestor of the hundreds of breeds of domestic rabbit and has been introduced on every continent except Antarctica. Wild rabbits not included in Oryctolagus and Sylvilagus include several species of limited distribution. The latter, Sylvilagus, includes over 13 wild rabbit species, among them the cottontails and tapetis.
