Global Positioning System Because all of the satellite signals are modulated onto the same L1 carrier frequency, the signals must be separated after The Global Positioning System (GPS) is a satellite-based hyperbolic navigation system owned by the United States Space Force and operated by Mission Delta 31. It provides critical positioning capabilities to military, civil, and commercial users around the world. It does not require the user to transmit any data, and operates independently of any telephone or Internet reception, though these technologies can enhance the usefulness of the GPS positioning information. Although the United States government created, controls, and maintains the GPS system, it is freely accessible to anyone with a GPS receiver. It is one of the global navigation satellite systems (GNSS) that provide geolocation and time information to a GPS receiver anywhere on or near the Earth where signal quality permits. The Mobile Telephone Service was one of the earliest mobile telephone standards. It was operator assisted in both directions, meaning that if one were called from a land line the call would be routed to a mobile operator, who would route it to one's phone. Signal-flow graph processes the input signals it receives. This mathematical theory of digraphs exists, of course, quite apart from its applications. Each non-source node combines the input signals in some manner, and broadcasts a resulting signal along each outgoing A signal-flow graph or signal-flowgraph (SFG), invented by Claude Shannon, but often called a Mason graph after Samuel Jefferson Mason who coined the term, is a specialized flow graph, a directed graph in which nodes represent system variables, and branches (edges, arcs, or arrows) represent functional connections between pairs of nodes. Thus, signal-flow graph theory builds on that of directed graphs (also called digraphs), which includes as well that of oriented graphs

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
