Applied ethics It is ethics with respect to real-world actions and their moral considerations in private and public life, the professions, health, technology, law, and leadership. Environmental ethics is concerned with ecological issues such as the responsibility of government and corporations to clean up pollution. Medical ethics These values include the respect for autonomy, non-maleficence, beneficence, and justice. Medical ethics is an applied branch of ethics which analyzes the practice of clinical medicine and related scientific research. However, a conflict may arise leading to the need for hierarchy in an ethical system, such that some moral elements overrule others with the purpose of applying the best moral judgement to a difficult medical situation. Medical ethics is based on a set of values that professionals can refer to in the case of any confusion or conflict. Such tenets may allow doctors, care

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providers, and families to create a treatment plan and work towards the same common goal. The word professionalism originally applied to vows of a religious order. By no later than the year 1675, the term had seen secular application and was applied to the three learned professions: divinity, law, and medicine. The term

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professionalism was also used for the military profession around this same time. dbf3983cd9 Ethics (also known as moral philosophy) is the branch of philosophy that involves systematizing, defending, and recommending concepts of right and wrong conduct.
