As a professor at the University of Giessen, he devised the modern laboratory-oriented teaching method, and for such innovations, he is regarded as one of the most outstanding chemistry teachers of all time

Each ion can be either monatomic, such as sodium (Na^+) and chloride (Cl^-) in sodium chloride, or polyatomic, such as ammonium (NH_4^+) and carbonate (CO_3^{2-}) ions in ammonium carbonate.
