Coronary catheterization is one of the several cardiology diagnostic tests and procedures. Specifically, through the injection of a liquid radiocontrast agent and illumination with X-rays, angiocardiology allows the recognition of occlusion, stenosis, restenosis, thrombosis or aneurysmal enlargement of the coronary artery lumens; heart chamber size; heart muscle contraction performance; and some aspects of heart valve function. Important internal heart and lung blood pressures, not measurable from outside the body, can be accurately measured during the test. Coronary catheterization test, calcification within the artery walls, located in the outer edges of atheroma within the artery walls, is sometimes recognizable on fluoroscopy A coronary catheterization is a minimally invasive procedure to access the coronary circulation and blood filled chambers of the heart using a catheter. Radiography tests were developed, it was natural for the radiographers to be trained in and to adopt this new technology. Radiographers now perform fluoroscopy, Radiography is an imaging technique using X-rays, gamma rays, or similar ionizing radiation and non-ionizing radiation to view the internal form of an object. A certain amount of the X-rays or other radiation are absorbed by the object, dependent on the object's density and structural composition. Similar techniques are used in airport security, (where "body scanners" generally use backscatter X-ray). Applications of radiography include medical ("diagnostic" radiography and "therapeutic radiography") and industrial radiography. To create an image in conventional radiography, a beam of X-rays is produced by an X-ray generator and it is projected towards the object. The X-rays that pass through the object are captured behind the object by a detector (either photographic film or a digital detector 755d6db6f9

The exam ends when the person voids while the radiologist is watching under fluoroscopy. Consumption. It is used in the diagnosis of vesicoureteral reflux (kidney reflux), among other disorders. The technique consists of catheterizing the person in order to fill the bladder with a radiocontrast agent, typically diatrizoic acid. If the contrast moves into the ureters and back into the kidneys, the radiologist makes the diagnosis of vesicoureteral reflux, and gives the degree of severity a score. Under fluoroscopy (real time x-rays) the radiologist watches the contrast enter the bladder and looks at the anatomy of the patient 755d6db6f9

Clinical cardiac electrophysiology Cardiologists with expertise in this area are usually referred to as electrophysiologists. intracardiac catheters (as are used during an electrophysiology study), fluoroscopy (a real-time X-ray camera), and electrical recordings from the inside Clinical cardiac electrophysiology (also referred to as cardiac electrophysiology or simply EP) is a branch of the medical specialty of cardiology concerned with the study and treatment of rhythm disorders of the heart. They are trained to perform interventional and surgical procedures to treat cardiac arrhythmia. Electrophysiologists are trained in the mechanism, function, and performance of the electrical activities of the heart. Electrophysiologists work closely with other cardiologists and cardiac surgeons to assist or guide therapy for heart rhythm disturbances (arrhythmias) 755d6db6f9

Nerve block Neurolytic block, the deliberate temporary degeneration of nerve fibers through the application of chemicals, heat, or freezing, produces a block that may persist for weeks, months, or indefinitely. One study found about 0. 40 mSv exposure per minute of fluoroscopy for up to 3 Nerve block or regional nerve blockade is any deliberate interruption of signals traveling along a nerve, often for the purpose of pain relief. Because neurectomy of a sensory nerve is often followed, months later, by the emergence of new, more intense pain. Neurectomy, the cutting through or removal of a nerve or a section of a nerve, usually produces a permanent block. Local anesthetic nerve block (sometimes referred to as simply "nerve block") is a short-term block, usually lasting hours or days, involving the injection of an anesthetic, a corticosteroid, and other agents onto or near a nerve. than a CT-guided injection (which is itself lower than a full CT scan) 755d6db6f9

Upper gastrointestinal series A contrast medium, usually a radiocontrast agent such as barium sulfate mixed with water, is ingested or instilled into the gastrointestinal tract, and X-rays are used to create radiographs of the regions of interest. size, shape, contour, and patency are visible to the examiner. The barium enhances the visibility of the relevant parts of the gastrointestinal tract by coating the inside wall of the tract and appearing white on the film. This in combination with other plain radiographs allows for the imaging of parts of the upper gastrointestinal tract such as the pharynx, larynx, esophagus, stomach, and small intestine such that the inside wall lining, size, shape, contour. also possible to visualize the functional movement of examined An upper gastrointestinal series, also called a barium swallow, barium study, or barium meal, is a series of radiographs used to examine the gastrointestinal tract for abnormalities 755d6db6f9

This is useful for both diagnosis and therapy and occurs in general radiology, interventional radiology, and image-guided surgery.
