Surface runoff (also known as overland flow or terrestrial runoff) is the unconfined flow of water over the ground surface, in contrast to channel runoff (or stream flow). This can occur when the soil is saturated by water to its full capacity, and the rain arrives more quickly than the soil can absorb it.
