Register (air and heating) In contrast, returns (grilled ducts which suck air back into the HVAC system for heating or cooling) are usually placed in the wall A register is a grille with moving parts, capable of being opened and closed and the air flow directed, which is part of a building's heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) system. heat/cooling loss occurs. Fume hood The device is an enclosure with a movable sash window on one side that traps and exhausts gases and particulates either out of the area (through a duct) or back into the room (through air filtration), and is most frequently used in laboratory settings. Most fume hoods are ducted and vent air out A fume hood (sometimes called a fume cupboard or fume closet, not to be confused with Extractor hood) is a type of local exhaust ventilation device that is designed to prevent users from being exposed to hazardous fumes, vapors, and dusts. equipped with scrubber systems. Fume hoods of all types require regular maintenance to ensure the safety of users efeb89a982

Heating, ventilation, and air conditioning design, and specify the HVAC systems. "Refrigeration" is sometimes added to the field's abbreviation as HVAC&R or HVACR, or "ventilation" is dropped, as in HACR (as in the designation of HACR-rated circuit breakers). Fire damper Fire/smoke dampers are similar to fire dampers in fire resistance rating, and also prevent the spread of smoke inside the ducts.
