Gregor Mendel, a Moravian Augustinian friar working in the 19th century in Brno, was the first to study genetics scientifically. This term, still used today, is a somewhat ambiguous definition of what is referred to as a gene. subfield of genomics, research that uses computational tools to search for and analyze patterns in the full genomes of organisms.
