Philosophy of science is both a theoretical and empirical discipline, relying on philosophical theorising as well as meta-studies of

scientific practice. Ethical issues such as bioethics and scientific misconduct are often considered. and even Kant), philosophy of biology only emerged as an independent field of philosophy in the 1960s and 1970s. Philosophy of science focuses on metaphysical, epistemic and semantic aspects of scientific practice, and overlaps with metaphysics, ontology, logic, and epistemology, for example, when it explores the relationship between science and the concept of truth. A History of Western Philosophy When Russell was awarded the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1950, A History of Western Philosophy was cited as one of the books that won him the award. faulted it for Russell's concentration on pre-Cartesian philosophy, lack of understanding of Immanuel Kant, and overgeneralization and omissions. The book was criticised, however, for overgeneralizations and omissions, particularly from the post-Cartesian period, but nevertheless became a popular and commercial success, and has remained in print from its first publication. Its success provided Russell with financial security for the last part of his life. A survey of Western philosophy from the pre-Socratic philosophers to the early 20th century, each major division of the book is prefaced by an account of the historical background necessary to understand the currents of thought it describes.
