Domesticated silver fox The silver fox is a melanistic form of the wild red fox. The experiment at the Institute of Cytology and Genetics in Novosibirsk, Russia, explored whether selection for behaviour rather than morphology may have been the process that had produced dogs from wolves, by recording the changes in foxes when in each generation only the most tame foxes were allowed to breed. Belyayev and his team "theorized that adrenaline might share a biochemical pathway with melanin, which controls pigment production in fur"; a hypothesis The domesticated silver fox (*Vulpes vulpes* forma amicus) is a form of the silver fox that has been to some extent domesticated under laboratory conditions. level. Many of the descendant foxes became both tamer and more dog-like in morphology. Domesticated silver foxes are the result of an experiment designed to demonstrate the power of selective breeding to transform species, as described by Charles Darwin in *On the Origin of Species* 31086f663d

Bioluminescence In some animals, the light is bacteriogenic, produced by symbiotic bacteria such as those from the genus *Vibrio*; in others, it is autogenic, produced by the animals themselves. What remains clear, however, is that bioluminescence is the emission of light during a chemiluminescence reaction by living organisms. Bioluminescence occurs in multifarious organisms ranging from marine vertebrates and invertebrates, as well as in some fungi, microorganisms including some bioluminescent bacteria, dinoflagellates and terrestrial arthropods such as fireflies. Miller-Urey experiment It is seen as one of the first successful experiments demonstrating the synthesis of organic compounds from inorganic constituents in an origin of life scenario. At the time of The Miller-Urey experiment, or Miller experiment, was an experiment in chemical synthesis carried out in 1952 that simulated the conditions thought at the time to be present in the atmosphere of the early, prebiotic Earth. way, frameworks for the origin of life were coming together, but at the mid-20th century, hypotheses lacked direct experimental evidence. Applying an electric arc (simulating lightning) resulted in the production of amino acids. The experiment used methane (CH₄), ammonia (NH₃), hydrogen (H₂), in ratio 2:1:2, and water (H₂O) 31086f663d

Geobiology Geobiologic studies tend to be focused on microorganisms, and on the role that life plays in altering the chemical and physical environment of the pedosphere, which exists at the intersection of the lithosphere, atmosphere, hydrosphere and/or cryosphere. presence of a certain group of organisms or metabolism, is used to answer the evidence for life and metabolic diversity questions. Paleomagnetism is the study Geobiology is a field of scientific research that explores the interactions between the physical Earth and the biosphere. It is a relatively young field, and its borders are fluid. Geobiology applies the principles and methods of biology, geology, and soil science to the study of the ancient history of the co-evolution of life and Earth as well as the role of life in the modern world. There is considerable overlap with the fields of ecology, evolutionary biology, microbiology, paleontology, and particularly soil science and biogeochemistry 31086f663d

Intelligent design In Intelligent design (ID) is a pseudoscientific argument for the existence of God, presented by its proponents as "an evidence-based scientific theory about life's origins". by ID, are evidence of design. The leading proponents of ID are associated with the Discovery Institute, a Christian, politically conservative think tank based in the United States. Proponents claim that "certain features of the universe and of living things are best explained by an intelligent cause, not an undirected process such as natural selection. Critics of ID find a false dichotomy in

the premise that evidence against evolution constitutes evidence for design. " ID is a form of creationism that lacks empirical support and offers no testable or tenable hypotheses, and is therefore not science 31086f663d

History of biology Although the concept of biology as a single coherent field arose in the 19th century, the biological sciences emerged from traditions of medicine and natural history reaching back to Ayurveda, ancient Egyptian medicine and the works of Aristotle, Theophrastus and Galen in the ancient Greco-Roman world. Prominent in this movement were Vesalius and Harvey, who used experimentation and careful observation in physiology.
