It is the primary model for standards-based mathematics. They form a national vision for preschool through twelfth grade mathematics education in the US and Canada.

The evidence-based education movement has its roots in the larger movement towards evidence-based practices, and has been the subject of considerable debate since the late 1990s. However, research published in 2020 showed that belief is high amongst educators in teaching techniques such as matching instruction to a few supposed learning styles and the cone of learning despite absence of empirical evidence. **Early MOOCs** (cMOOCs: Connectivist MOOCs) often emphasized open-access features, such as open licensing of content, structure and learning... **Online tutoring** is practiced using many different approaches for distinct sets of users. The distinctions are in content and user interface, as well as in tutoring styles and tutor-training methodologies.
