Many of the language departments of the Foreign Service Institute of the U. direct method was an answer to the dissatisfaction with the older grammar translation method, which teaches students grammar and vocabulary through direct translations The direct method of teaching, which is sometimes called the natural method, and is often (but not exclusively) used in teaching foreign languages, refrains from using the learners' native language and uses only the target language. It was adopted by key international language schools such as Berlitz, Alliance Française, and Inlingua School of Languages in the 1970s. State Department adopted the Method starting in 2012. It was established in England around 1900 and contrasts with the grammar-translation method and other traditional approaches, as well as with C. Dodson's bilingual method 7e04896b00
