Today almost all computers are connected to a computer network, such as the global Internet or an embedded network such as those found in modern cars
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Radio used. Collision avoidance system – a short range radar Radio is the technology of communicating using radio waves. In addition to communication, radio is used for radar, radio navigation, remote control, remote sensing, and other applications. Since radio waves cannot penetrate very far into earth, the depth of GPR is limited to about 50 feet. Radio waves are electromagnetic waves of frequency between 3 Hertz (Hz) and 300 gigahertz (GHz). They are generated by an electronic device called a transmitter connected to an antenna which radiates the waves. They can be received by other antennas connected to a radio receiver; this is the fundamental principle of radio communication
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4G 5G GPRS system, cellular systems have provided dual infrastructures: packet switched nodes for data

services, and circuit switched 4G refers to the fourth generation of cellular network technology, first introduced in the late 2000s and early 2010s. It also has considerably higher data bandwidth compared to 3G, enabling a variety of data-intensive applications such as high-definition media streaming and the expansion of Internet of Things (IoT) applications. Compared to preceding third-generation (3G) technologies, 4G has been designed to support all-IP communications and broadband services, and eliminates circuit switching in voice telephony.
