The King of the Cats Walter Scott reported that it was a well known nursery tale in the Scottish Highlands in the eighteenth century. The earliest known example is found in Beware the Cat, written by William Baldwin in 1553, though it is related to the first-century story of "The Death of Pan". Other notable versions include one in a letter written by Thomas Lyttelton, 2nd Baron Lyttelton, first published in 1782, M. G. Tales. Burne. It can be categorised as a "death of an elf (or cat)" tale: Aarne-Thompson-Uther type 113A, or Christiansen migratory legend type 6070B.
