Dental dam Its purpose is both to prevent saliva interfering with the dental work (e. g. In dentistry, use of a rubber dam is sometimes referred to as isolation. It is used mainly in endodontic, fixed prosthodontic (crowns, bridges) and general restorative treatments. Sometimes termed "Kofferdam" (from German), it was designed in the United States in 1864 by Sanford Christie Barnum. Dental implant dental implant (also known as an endosseous implant or fixture) is a prosthesis that interfaces with the bone of the jaw or skull to support a dental A dental implant (also known as an endosseous implant or fixture) is a prosthesis that interfaces with the bone of the jaw or skull to support a dental prosthesis such as a crown, bridge, denture, or facial prosthesis or to act as an orthodontic anchor. The basis for

modern dental implants is a biological process called osseointegration, in which materials such as titanium or zirconia form an intimate bond to the bone. A variable amount of healing time is required for osseointegration before either the dental prosthetic (a tooth, bridge, or denture) is attached to the implant or an abutment is placed which will hold a dental prosthetic or crown. The implant fixture is first placed so that it is likely to osseointegrate, then a dental prosthetic is added cf4ec459ae

The type of apparatus used clinically will vary depending on the required function dictated by the dental procedure. It is common for a light source and cooling water-spray system to also be incorporated into certain handpieces; this improves visibility, accuracy, and the overall success of the procedure.
