Golding Bird From 1836, he lectured at Guy's Hospital, a well-known teaching hospital in London and now part of King's College London, and published a popular textbook on science for medical students called *Elements of Natural Philosophy*. He was also notable for his work in related sciences, especially the medical uses of electricity and electrochemistry. In their review of the 6th edition, *Popular Science Review* noted that the author was now named as Brooke Golding Bird (9 December 1814 – 27 October 1854) was a British medical doctor and a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians. electricity and light were particularly recommended. He became a great authority on kidney diseases and published a comprehensive paper on urinary deposits in 1844

Myelin axons acquiring myelin sheaths. Myelin ensheaths part of an axon known as an internodal segment, in multiple myelin layers of a tightly regulated internodal length. However, unlike the plastic covering on an electrical wire, myelin does not form a single long sheath over the entire length of the axon. The myelinated axon can be likened to an electrical wire (the axon) with insulating material (myelin) around it. Years after recovery, post-polio syndrome may occur, with a slow development of muscle weakness similar to what the person had during the initial infection. These symptoms usually pass within one or two weeks. replicating in and destroying motor neurons within the spinal cord, brain stem, or motor cortex. A less common symptom is permanent paralysis, and possible death in extreme cases. Approximately 75% of cases are asymptomatic; mild symptoms which can occur include sore throat and fever; in a proportion of cases more severe symptoms develop such as headache, neck stiffness, and paresthesia 0a6efea88a
